U.S. House of Representatives

Overview: In the 2020 election thus far, **54 seats** in the House of Representatives have shifted to now being held by congressional newcomers. Of these, **3 seats** were flipped from Republican to Democratic control, and **8 seats** were flipped from Democratic to Republican control.
