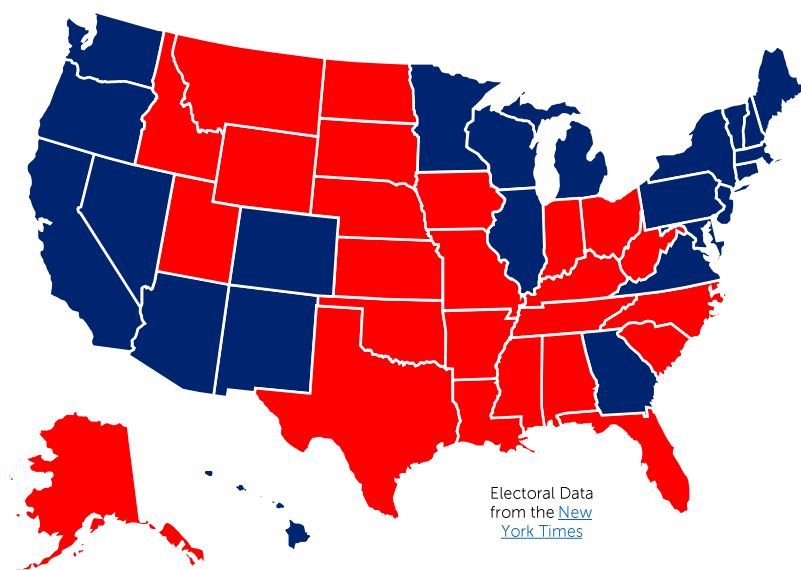


Election Outcomes as of Nov. 13th

Administration.



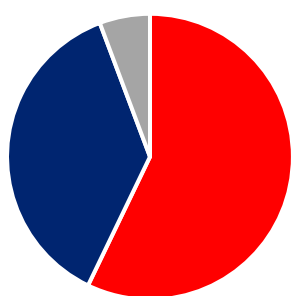
- 306 electoral votes for Joe Biden
- 232 electoral votes for Donald Trump

State of Play

- Yesterday evening, [Arizona](#) was officially called in favor of presumptive President-elect Joe Biden by a margin of over 11,000 votes. This added 11 Electoral College votes to Biden's lead.
- This afternoon, [North Carolina](#) was called in favor of Donald Trump by a margin of a margin of over 73,000 votes. This added 15 Electoral College votes for incumbent President Trump.
- Also today, [Georgia](#) was called in favor of President-elect Joe Biden by a margin of over 14,000 votes. This added 16 Electoral College votes to Biden's lead.

Senate.

Current Standings for the 35 Seats at Play



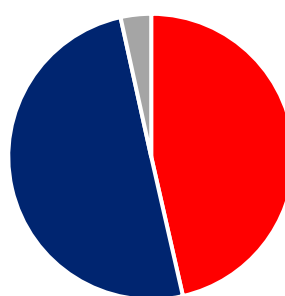
- 20 seats declared Republican
- 13 seats declared Democratic
- 2 seats undeclared

Key Remaining Seats

- [Incumbent Sen. Dan Sullivan \(R-AK\)](#) was officially declared the winner of his reelection race against Democratic challenger Al Gross – 57.5% vs. 37.5%.
- [Incumbent Sen. Thom Tillis \(R-NC\)](#) was officially declared the winner of his reelection race against Democratic challenger Cal Cunningham – 48.7% vs. 47.0%.
- Incumbent Sen. David Perdue (R-GA) did not garner 50% of the votes in his reelection race against Democratic challenger Jon Ossoff. The race is now proceeding to a run-off, which will be held on January 5th.
- Incumbent Sen. Kelly Loeffler (R-GA) did not garner 50% of the votes in her reelection race against Democratic challenger Raphael Warnock. The race is now proceeding to a run-off, which will be held on January 5th.

House.

Current Standings for All 435 Seats



- 202 seats declared Republican
- 218 seats declared Democratic
- 15 seats undeclared

Key Developments & Shifts

- House Republicans have flipped 9 seats that were previously held by Democrats. The following Republicans now hold these districts:
 - California's 48th: Michelle Steel
 - Florida's 26th: Carlos Gimenez
 - Florida's 27th: Maria Salazar
 - Iowa's 1st: Ashley Hinson
 - Michigan's 3rd: Peter Meijer
 - Minnesota's 7th: Michelle Fischbach
 - New Mexico's 2nd: Yvette Herrell
 - Oklahoma's 5th: Stephanie Bice
 - South Carolina's 1st: Nancy Mace
- Meanwhile, House Democrats have flipped 3 seats that were previously held by Republicans. The following Democrats now hold these districts:
 - Georgia's 7th: Carolyn Bourdeaux
 - North Carolina's 2nd: Deborah Ross
 - North Carolina's 6th: Kathy Manning
